

ROAD AND WEATHER NET
INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION SHEET

WHAT DO I SAY AND WHEN DO I SAY IT?

You are net control so as such, you are in charge and can operate about anyway you wish (within reason) as long as you do not violate any laws. We have found, however, that the following "script" seems to help those who are a bit shy. Feel free to improvise as you see fit.

"This is (your call), acting as net control for the Kern County Road and Weather net. My name is (your name), and I am located in (your location). This is an informal net conducted by the members and friends of the Kern County Central Valley Amateur Radio Club. I will be monitoring the following W6LIE repeater s:

The Road and Weather Net is held on the Breckenridge Mountain repeater 145.150, negative offset down 600, tone 100 hertz, linked to the Grapevine Peak repeater 146.910, negative offset down 600, tone 100 hertz.. The purpose of this net is to relay information that would be of value to the traveling amateur operator. We are also here to assist in the event of any emergency.

Does anyone have any traffic, weather or emergency conditions to report, please come now. (If no response) This is (your call) monitoring."

DO YOU HAVE ANY HINTS?

Yes we do, we have found the following to be helpful:

1. Remind people of the net every 10 to 15 minutes if radio traffic is slow.
2. **Keep careful notes**, as the information may be very important later in the day when someone else takes over for you.
3. Be friendly! Many people are bored and/or sleepy and they just want to chat.
4. Allow routine traffic on our repeaters, but remind the users that a net is in progress and to leave space for people to break in with road, weather or emergency information. Everyone is usually very cooperative.
5. Most of all have some fun! You are doing a great service for your club and your community.

6. **Have ready access to a phone!** An emergency is not the time to run from room to room looking for the phone. A computer and police scanner are also handy!

Please remember folks; We are not broadcasters, we are amateurs, one way

station prior to announcing information. Per FCC Rules 97.113(b) "We cannot ID and

start giving traffic information without having two way communications established first.

Certain exceptions have been made in the rules for weather as long as the info comes from

a U.S. Government owned weather station, and not on a frequent basis.
